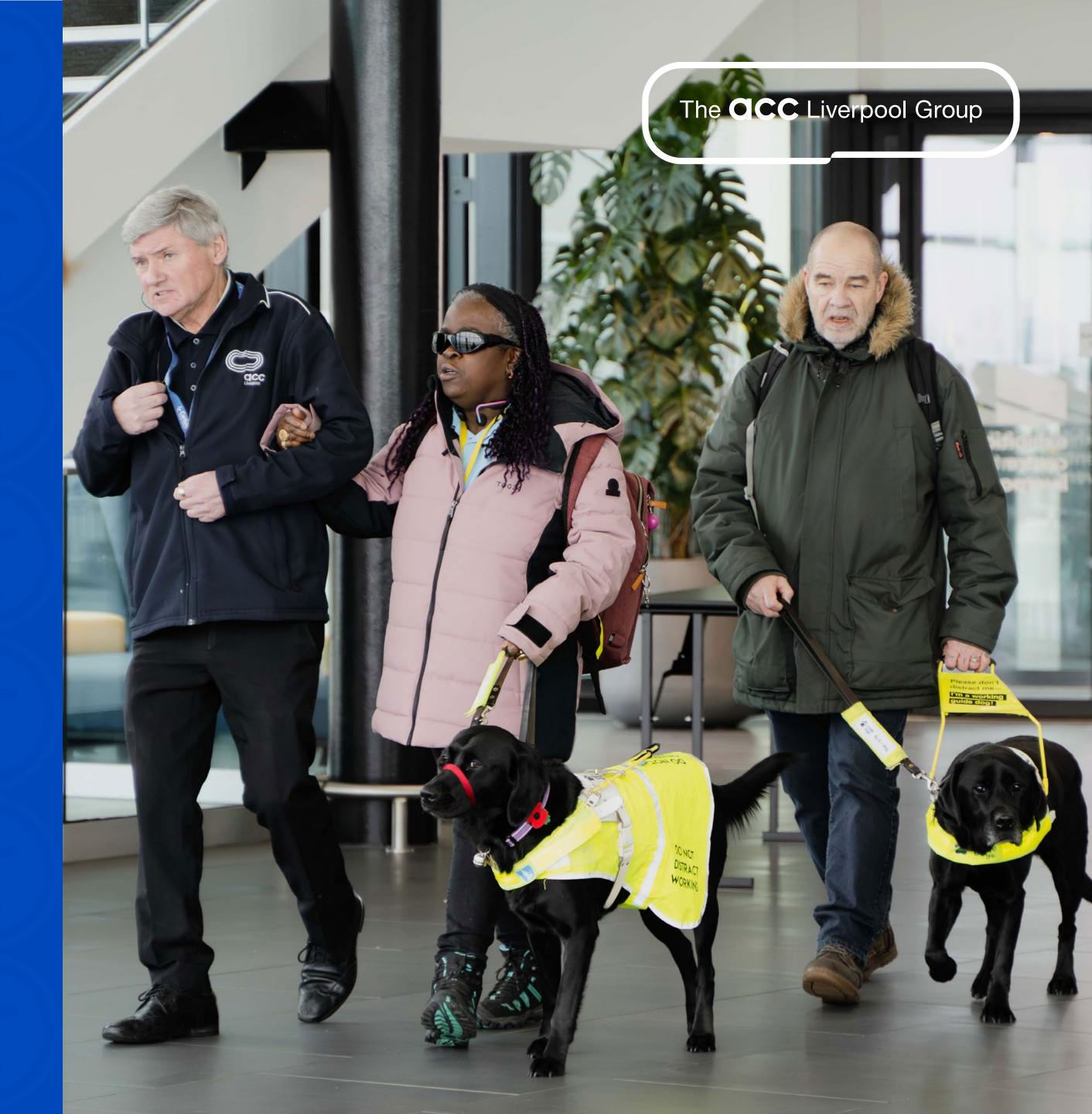

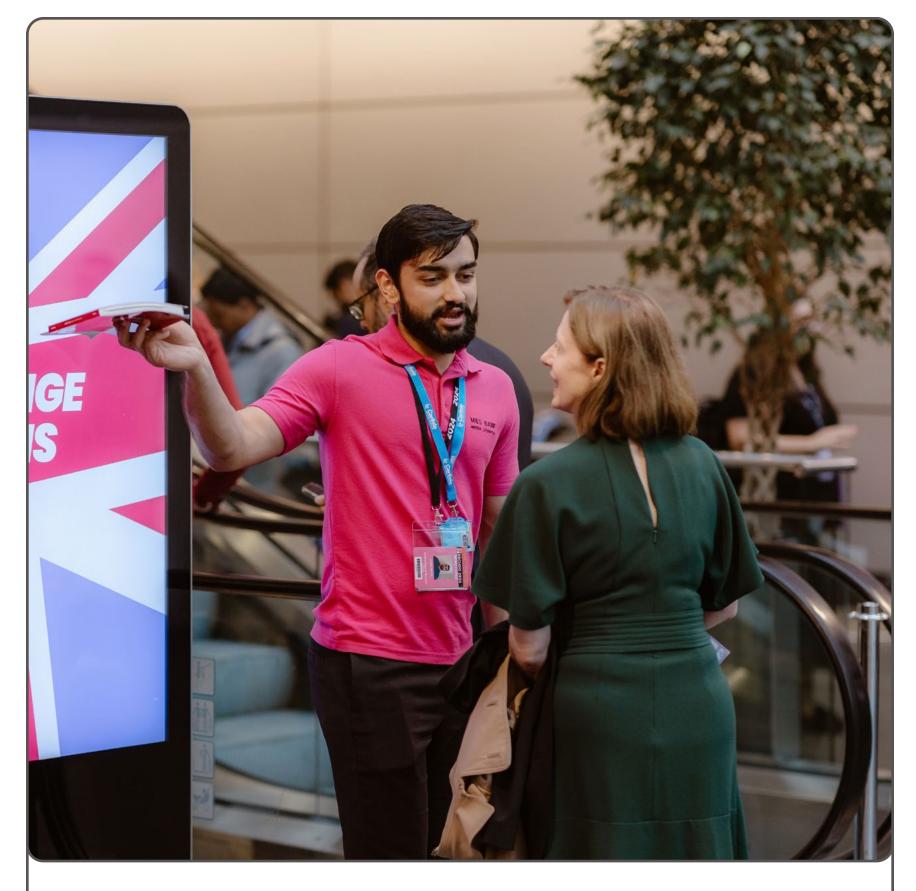
We aim to remove barriers to participation and make it our commitment to provide a safe and enjoyable experience for all visitors attending any event across our venues.

One of your brilliant staff took the time and effort to greet us when we arrived, made us feel like no trouble and escorted us all the way to our seats.

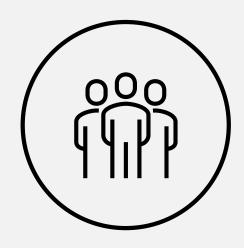




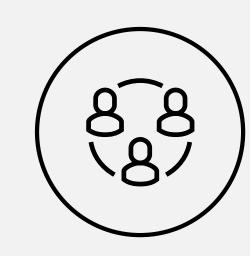

Value all feedback and use it to continually improve our customer experience

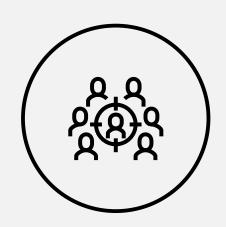


Be open and honest in what we can and can't do and explain why

We know that it will take time to embed new practices, and not all aims can be addressed at once. These are the priorities we have identified as part of our five year plan:



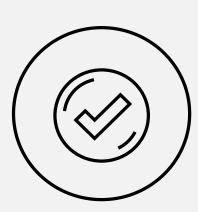
Engage with visitors to shape inclusive experiences

This year we will add a dedicated accessibility section to our post-event consumer surveys, and by 2030 we aim to track a 10% increase in positive accessibility feedback.



Embed Accessibility into new developments

From this year, 100% of new development projects taking place on our site will include accessibility reviews at the concept stage.



Support a culture of inclusion and respect

We will continue to deliver accessible customer service training to all staff and ensure 100% fulfilment rates. We will also continue to launch awareness schemes across the business to ensure that our audience needs are anticipated and addressed

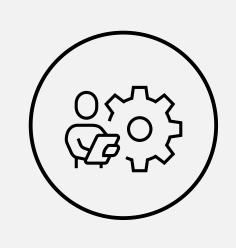
